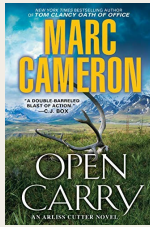

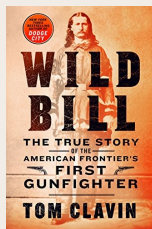

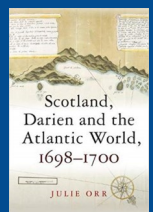

### Scotland, Darien and the Atlantic World – Julie Orr

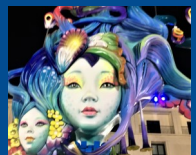
Encompassing espionage, contraband trade, shipwreck, religious conflict and the vital role of the indigenous Cuna, the story of Scotland's failed seventeenth-century colony in Panama provides one of history's cautionary tales. Exemplifying unanticipated consequences resulting from pursuit of economic advantage, the "Darien Disaster" echoes across the centuries and underscores the critical role of historical perspective in international relations. Dr. Julie Orr is the author of *Scotland, Darien and the Atlantic World, 1698-1700*, published in 2018 by Edinburgh University Press.

### Summer Solstice in Alicante – Janneli Miller

In Alicante, Spain the entire month of June is devoted to summer solstice celebrations. The festival in the Mediterranean city of roughly 300,000 includes hour long parades, music and dancing in the streets, firework displays, pyrotechnic explosions, food and beer booths, and culminates on June 24- the feast day of St. John- with the burning of giant statues all over the city. Dr. Janneli F. Miller taught a course in Gender and Health at the University of Alicante in the summer of 2018, and will share some of her photos of the festival. 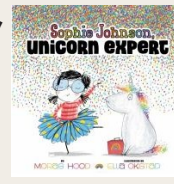
